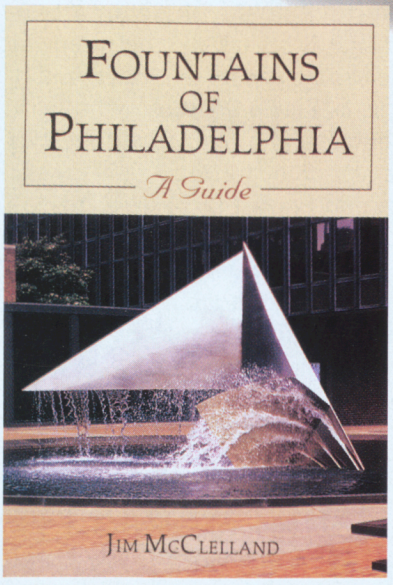

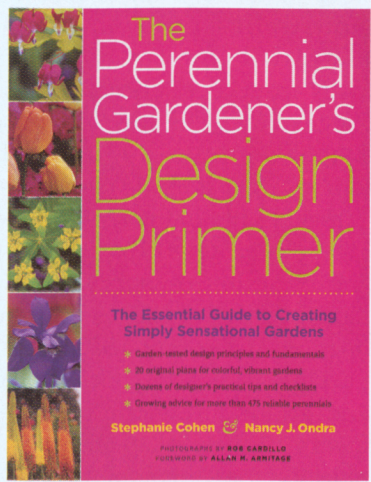
Sacred Spaces: Princeton Parties, Gatherings and Celebrations

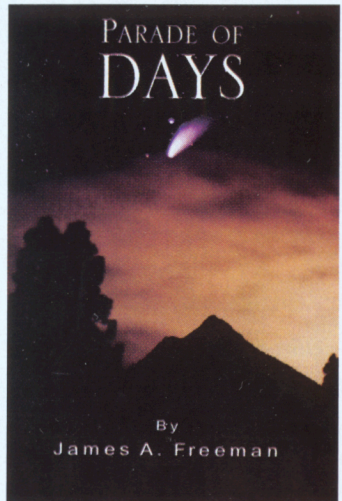
The Perennial Gardener's Design Primer
